

David Peterson's 3rd Saturday Paint Out Effie Yeaw Nature Center - Ancil Hoffman Park 9:30 am-12:30 pm Saturday, January 21, 2017

Artists will meet up to paint at the Effie Yeaw Nature Center. David Peterson will be near the picnic area in front of the Nature Center. David will have entry forms for "Art Where Wild Things Are VII", and, if you wish, watch a short plein air demo by David. You are encouraged to visit the Nature Center and leave a donation!

We will paint in the preserve, please stay on trails. There is a bit of walk to the river, you may find the verdant riparian landscape and animals of the preserve a challenging subject to paint with rewarding results.

How to get there: Ancil Hoffman Park is located on Tarshes Drive. From U.S. Highway 50, take the Watt Avenue off-ramp. Head north to Fair Oaks Blvd and make a right. Follow Fair Oaks Blvd. to Van Alstine and make another right. Make a left onto California Avenue, then turn right at the park's entrance. Continue straight past the toll booth. Turn left at Effie Yeaw turnoff and continue to the Nature Center parking area. There are restrooms, tables and a short walk to the river. Park Fees: \$5.00 per vehicle. Enforced. Do you have your annual pass yet?
